On behalf of the Stephy's Place Board of Directors, I am excited to introduce our first annual newsletter that captures all that we've accomplished in 2018. We couldn't have done it without the support of our donors and volunteers, and just as rewarding is the community we've built. The trust our participants have placed in us is inspiring: not only in our ability to help them find comfort in their darkest hours but in allowing us to help guide them in their quest to live again and integrate the loss of their precious loved one into their "new life."

In 2015, when Stephy's Place launched, we started with one support group. As of today, we've grown to over 29 groups and we're working hard to expand so we can welcome every person that comes through our doors. As a nonprofit organization, Stephy's Place relies upon donations and grants in order to operate. While all of the services we offer are completely free of charge to those who attend, the cost to Stephy's Place is \$800 per person, per year.

What we offer

The center's mission is to assist people as they take steps to move forward in grief and begin the journey of living with loss. We help in a variety of ways, including:

- Weekly/bi-weekly support groups.
- Quarterly gatherings and an annual holiday party that brings all of our groups together for a chance to meet and socialize.
- An annual vigil on National Grief Awareness Day to offer an opportunity to connect with other people that are grieving and remember loved ones they have lost.
- A gift bag that includes various items that can aid in the grieving process, upon joining a group.
- A lending library that includes reading materials on loss and grief.
- Daily facebook posts for all grievers near or far

Fundraisers

Our staff is made up of over 40 volunteers who take on various roles to run Stephy's Place. We have only one full time paid employee. To that end, out of every dollar that is donated to Stephy's Place, less than 1 cent covers our administrative costs.

MOURNING WALK - A JOURNEY IN THE LIGHT

In September, Stephy's Place hosted its first annual "Mourning Walk - A Journey In the Light." The event began at Seven Presidents Oceanfront Park in Long Branch, NJ. Following a short meditation and butterfly release, more than 300 participants walked in Long Branch from Seven Presidents Oceanfront Park to Pier Village and back, while remembering their deceased loved ones. The event signified the walkers' intentions to move forward although grieving, and to continue their life's journey of living with loss.

Sponsored by many local businesses and participants, Mourning Walk raised close to \$70K that will be used to grow and maintain the grief support services that Stephy's Place provides to hundreds of people.

COMEDY FOR A CAUSE

In July, nearly 200 people supported the first annual Stephy's Place Comedy For A Cause at the Middletown Arts Center. The event raised over \$11K to support Stephy's Place. It was sponsored by Michael Destefano, Saker ShopRites, Cups & Cakes, and Dreyfus Ashby & Co.

On June 3, 2015 my heart shattered after my son Jason was killed in a car accident. I was trying everything including counseling and a monthly open support group to put the pieces of my heart back together. I was living in a veil of darkness. Then in October of 2015 while researching groups for a friend, I stumbled across Stephy's Place. I started participating in the Tuesday night child loss group at Stephy's Place. I immediately felt the warmth and support from my facilitators Mary, Elaine and my new broken hearted friends. Slowly, with the help of my new Stephy's Place family, the dark veil lifted as I began my journey of how to live life without my son's physical presence. Most importantly, I learned how to help others again, an important part of my professional life as a social worker. Since Stephy's Place was a beacon of light during my darkest time, I wanted to give back, so in April 2017 I started cofacilitating a child loss group. I love being a companion to others on their grief journey. I am forever grateful to Stephy's Place for bringing light back to my life.
